Course structure

7 core and 6 elective units are delivered over 36 weeks

- 36 weeks of delivery
- 0 weeks of holidays
- 120 hours work placement

Delivery and assessment

- Delivered over 12 months in the work place (based on full-time employment).
- Part time options are available
- Once a month face-to-face contact learning support via email, phone and online tutorial support available on campus.

Assessments include case studies, group work, roleplays, written short answer questions, practical demonstrations, and a work-placement portfolio. Practice based training activities and tasks are conducted in a simulated environment only were they cannot be achieved within the employer.
