Course structure

16 units are delivered over 46 weeks of training delivered over 52 weeks.

- 40 weeks of classes and tutorials
- 6 weeks work placement (2 days/15 hours per week)
- 6 weeks holiday

Delivery and assessment

Delivered with a mix of hybrid face-to-face class time, online work, project work and industry experience at MCIE's Melbourne CBD Campus. Hybrid delivery allows participants to attend in real time, remotely, or sitting in a classroom supported by teachers and students.

Assessments include case studies, group work, roleplays, written short answer questions and scenario based practical demonstrations, case studies, work placement journals, logbooks, portfolios and projects Assessments are delivered online via the Canvas LMS.

Eligibility for government funded place

Pre-requisites

There are no formal prerequisite qualifications or units for entry to this qualification. However, there are detailed entry requirements. Working with Vulnerable People Check and/or a Police Check may be required by employers for work placement.

Work placement

Students are encouraged to undertake **90 hours** of work placement. The MCIE Work Placement Coordinator will support you in your search for placement with one of our host employers.
