Course structure

15 core and 2 elective units are delivered over a minimum of 52 weeks

- 48 weeks of delivery
- 4 weeks of holidays
- 160 hours work placement

Total course duration can vary depending on student progress.

Delivery and assessment

Delivered over 12 - 14 months in the work place (full-time employment). Once a month face-toface contact with learning support via email, phone and online.

Assessments include case studies, roleplays, short answer questions, practical demonstrations and a work-based training logbook and portfolios. Practice-based training activities and tasks are conducted in a simulated environments only where they cannot be achieved within the employer's workplace.

Eligibility for government funded place
